# Emergency Response Overview

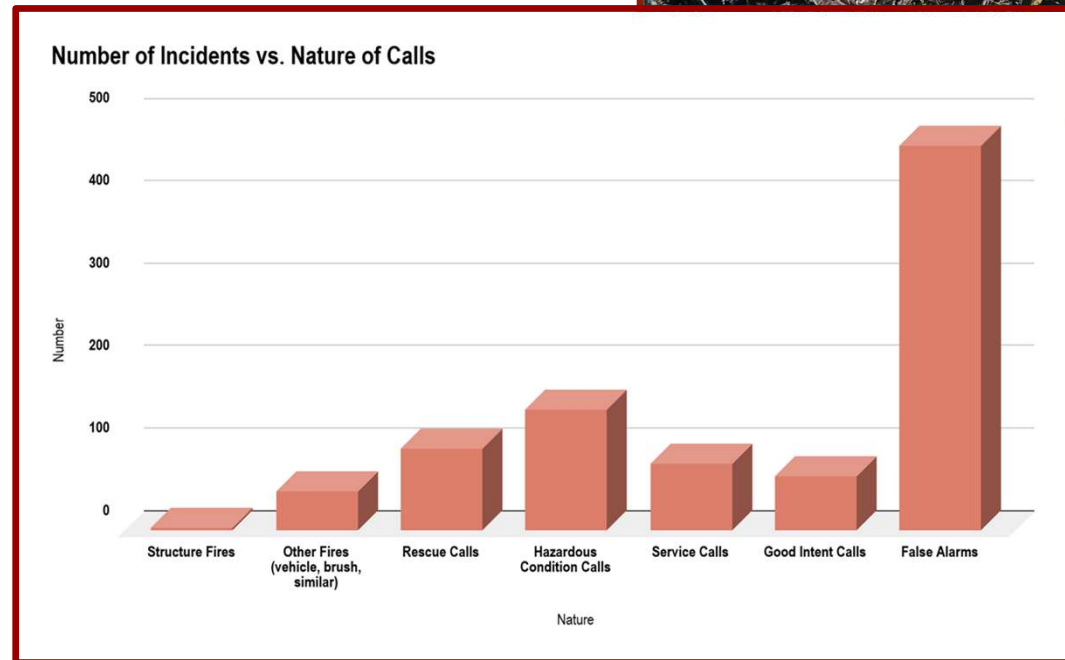
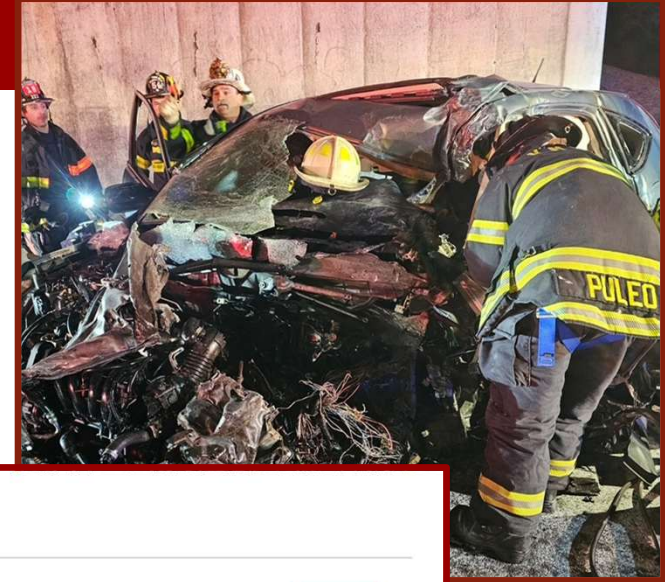
## 2025

- Total Incidents Responded: 912
- Reflects a wide range of emergencies requiring rapid, professional response
- Highlights the department's critical role in daily community safety



# Incident Breakdown

- 4 Structure Fires
- 48 Other Fires (vehicle, brush, similar)
- 100 Rescue Calls
- 147 Hazardous Condition Calls
- 81 Service Calls
- 66 Good Intent Calls
- 466 False Alarms

- **6,216 total training hours completed**
