FLOOD MITIGATION UPDATE

The Village continues to advance multiple projects to reduce flood risk and strengthen storm resiliency. A key initiative currently under review is the proposed removal of the Center Avenue pedestrian bridge, along with widening the river channel, creating flood benches, and stabilizing stream banks so floodwater can move more efficiently toward the Waverly Avenue Bridge (replaced in 2024). The pedestrian bridge would not be replaced. The Village applied for funding through the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's Resilient Watersheds Grant Program (Summer 2025) for this \$5.7 million project, and the timeline will depend on award decisions.

More broadly, studies by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, NYS DEC, and the Village have identified several bridges with undersized openings that can contribute to flooding. Current priority locations include Tompkins Avenue, Ward Avenue, the Center Avenue pedestrian bridge, and the pedestrian bridge over Beaver Swamp Brook in Shore Acres. At the same time, the Village is coordinating with neighboring Sound Shore communities through the Long Island Sound Watershed Intermunicipal Council (LISWIC) to improve regional stormwater planning and coordination.

Locally, staff are reviewing the Village's stormwater code and exploring ways to better support residents pursuing flood-resilient improvements, including streamlined permitting and public education. The Village is also developing a public GIS map of flood-mitigation projects and participating in Westchester County's Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan update to strengthen long-term planning and improve competitiveness for grants. Additional investments in stream gauges, cameras, emergency communications, and training for staff and volunteers are also being pursued to strengthen preparedness, response, and recovery for future storm events.



Follow snow emergency parking rules and posted restrictions



Fire Safety

Use space heaters and candles safely
Keep trees and decorations away from heat sources

Do not shovel or blow snow onto public property or into the roadway.



Tree Recycling

Curbside holiday tree collection begins in early January. Remove all lights, ornaments, and stands.



Leaf Removal

Loose curbside leaf collection has ended for the season. Please do not place loose leaves at the curb.

2025 RECAP

SUMMARY OF LOCAL LAWS ADOPTED

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES TO THE VILLAGE CODE

In 2025, the Village Board of Trustees adopted 18 local laws updating the Village Code in several key areas:

- **Good Government & Ethics:** Updated the Village's Code of Ethics, clarified the roles of the Village Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Village Manager, and created an independent claims auditor to review Village payments.
- **Zoning & Land Use:** Amended residential zoning standards (including housing provisions) to reduce allowable density in the Washingtonville neighborhood. Updated rules for pet care facilities and animal hospitals. Raised the project fee threshold that triggers Board of Architectural Review (unchanged since the 1970s). Refined special permits for food service establishments to reduce the burden of annual renewals at the request of the business community. The Board also created an automatic pause on certain land use approvals while zoning changes are under review. In addition, the Village has proposed revisions to strengthen the stormwater regulation code.
- **Battery Energy Storage Systems:** Adopted and extended a temporary moratorium on new battery energy storage system applications while the Village studies appropriate locations, safety standards, and zoning controls.
- **Parks, Trash, and Parking:** Updated the Parks chapter, strengthened standards and fines for trash receptacles and placement, and revised on-street parking rules for street cleaning and permit parking areas.
- **Budget & Taxation:** Adopted a balanced FY 25–26 budget and modernized the Village's taxation procedures, including definitions, filing and payment requirements, penalties, and the duties of Village finance officials.
